Full Moon

In a quiet moment, far removed from most of humanity, an astronaut took some bread, said a prayer and ate alone.

This is my body broken for you. (1 Corinthians 11:24)

He sipped some wine, and gazed out of his capsule window in wonder. The first time this simple meal had been celebrated was by Jesus and his disciples. It would have been bursting with profound meaning as the Jewish Passover meal was transformed into 'the last supper'.

Jesus wanted his followers to know and remember that he was going to have his body broken and his blood spilt in order that they could be saved and set free, just like their Jewish ancestors had been freed from slavery in Egypt centuries before.

Jesus came to save and restore a family, physically and spiritually. He did not come to make bad good, but to bring those dead in sin, to life in Him. Through the last supper Jesus declared down the ages; "I've done the work. I've paid the price, I've completed my mission for you, because I love you. It's never been about your goodness but always about my grace"

Two hours after the astronaut ate and drank, he too had a mission to complete; leaving his cramped quarters he stepped into history. Just like Jesus, he'd also made a trip, travelled a distance, a huge price had been paid, the race had been won, and the victory was about to be proclaimed. Our astronaut's name was Buzz Aldrin; The bread and wine



amounted to the first meal ever eaten on the lunar surface. Before Neil Armstrong walked on the moon, Buzz ate and drank on it.

Just like Jesus, no one has ever travelled so far, to eat so little, that says so much.



Q1. Share with each other a bit of your background, were you born in this country or have you arrived from elsewhere? What is your cultural or ethnic background?

Read Ephesians 2:17-19

- Q2. How does if feel to you to be part of God's family, what connects you to others in your Life group or at Riverside?
- Q3. As Darren said in his sermon a lot of Holy week seems to be centred around the Temple in Jerusalem. Share with each other what you know about the Temple - what was it used for and what did it symbolise?

Jesus was clear in his teaching that the temple was going to be destroyed (as it was in AD70) but he also talked about a different kind of Temple and a new kind of building. On one occasion in John 2 he gives us some clues as to the nature of this new Temple.

Read John 2:20-22

Q4. What exactly is Jesus saying here? How does he understand the Temple and what implications does that have for us?

Read Ephesians 2:20-22

- Q5. Whilst I hope you are all aware that we have the Holy Spirit within us connecting us to Jesus, Paul seems to be suggesting something bigger and better is being built. How do you understand verse 21, and how important is it for us to be together as a community.
- Q6. When have you felt God's presence most powerfully? Jesus and Paul are saying that God dwells in us most fully when we are together in community, in worship, service and fellowship. If that is not your experience what needs to change?

Whenever and wherever believers meet together, the dwelling place of God is established and becomes Holy ground.
